
#### CHILDCARE AT PAX CHRISTI:

# A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE BYRON

#### Dear Friends:

Last week at our regional prayer and listening sessions held in anticipation of the upcoming synod, Archbishop Hebda cited in his remarks a portion of Canon 212 from the Church's *Code of Canon Law*. The *Code*, as you may know, is the basic book of legal governance of



the Church's affairs (to say it too incompletely). It sets out the rights, obligations, responsibilities and, yes, punishments with which Catholic communities are to carry out their "business." It is not a book of theology, but hopefully it is well informed by sound theology. It's a rule book, essentially, which translates theology into nuts and bolts operating protocols.

The Archbishop referenced Canon 212 as the legal rationale for calling for the synod process now underway here in the archdiocese. Here is the text of what he quoted:

> According to the knowledge, competence, and prestige which they possess, they have the right and even at times the duty to manifest to the sacred pastors their opinion on matters which pertain to the good of the Church and to make their opinion known to the rest of the Christian faithful, without prejudice to the integrity of faith and morals, with reverence toward their pastors, and attentive to common advantage and the dignity of persons.

The "they" referred to here is we, the People of God. Perhaps it surprises you to know that this law exists in our church, and has since 1983. It tends not to get much spoken about sometimes in discussions between pastors (meaning priests and bishops) and people, especially during times of disputes. I'm delighted that Archbishop Hebda has found it and has taken it seriously.

But I would wish to take it a step further by noting that the People of God enjoy this right and duty not primarily because it is allowed by law but because it is inherent in what it means to belong to the community of the baptized. Canon 212 does not grant a privilege to the faithful that we would not otherwise have. Rather, it merely acknowledges a responsibility that is already ours by God's grace.

This opens out onto a whole larger conversation about the role of law in the way that we Christians live, both within the Church and in the broader society. Without discarding the need for legal structures in both realms, there can be a stultifying temptation to reduce the practice of both faith and citizenship to obeying the rules (or refusing to). Good moral behavior ought to occur not primarily because it's allowed by law but because it springs from the essence of what it means to be a good human being and a faithful Christian disciple. Too many of our public conversations can get mired in mere recitations of statutes.
