- 1. Decision Made: Charis Ecumenical Catholic Community (ECC) Lead by Trish Vanni will meet at Prairie Lutheran Church. They were grateful for Pax Christi considering space for them.
- 2. Revision to be made to the Investment Fund by Jeanne Roffee

Jeanne explained that any change of the operating budget requires approval from the Community Council.

Motion/Purpose of Revision: To change the Risk Tolerance Policy to allow more flexibility of the management of the General Operating funds to move from a fixed income to equity position.

The following factors or benefits all are favorable for the outcome of this motion:

- Currently there is a significant cushion in the operating budget.
- Portfolio Diversity is beneficial to the growth of the investments
- Portfolios are reviewed at the end of each month
- Making these changes to the Pax Investment portfolio only occur when the market is a down draft.
- Making this change will align with the other Pax Investments.

Motion passed for approval by Clarissa Lobo and seconded by Mary Lillicrap.

Vote passed.

3. Catholic Appeal for Climate Action letter to President Biden and the US Congress.

Mary Lanners introduced Peg Musegades from the Justice council to explain the appeal letter to President Biden and Congress.

- COP26 (Conference of Parties) will be held in Glasgow, Scotland in November 2021 with 197 countries being represented to encouraging the continued changes to the climate.
- Peg and Mary are looking for the approval to send this letter.
- The question was asked; is this a decision for the parish or for the Community Council to make?
- Answer: Community Council approved the motion to send the letter
- Tish Osborn declared yes to send and Mary Lanners second the motion

Topic: Community Council Report – Tish- See Council minutes for further details

Discussion: Tish reported on the Community Council decision concerning The Ecumenical Community location and the request for responses to the question of most pressing/critical issues for Pax.

ACG Team members' responses to Pax "pressing/critical issues" due to Tish to enable her compilation and submission by 10/25.

Also, due to Christmas preparations the December 21st council meetings have been changed to December 14th.

Topic: Rebranding and Signage design project- Ken Tom, Renee and Tish

Discussion: Goal is to have consistent signage with Braille capability developed for Pax campus rooms, etc. We reviewed samples of backing options for the laser signs including birch based options. Clarifications from Pat Nault on the rules related to ADA compliance resulted in discussions about reversing the laser process to a negative process, defined as creating signs as raised letters and numbers rather than a more typical removal of the letters, numbers, etc., Ken was confident the laser could complete such a change and has agreed to provide some samples for the ACG team prior to our next meeting. In addition, Ken will time the process to ensure the timing of creating 300+ signs will be reasonable. Pat Nault agreed to procure some Braille samples before our next meeting to enable review and testing.

Topic: Status of miscellaneous projects -

Discussion/ Decisions:

- **1. Entrance 7 fascia** Pax must hire a contractor to complete this job due to working at height. Contractor selected at \$7K expense. Composite material selected, so immediate painting is not a requirement.
- 2. Arborvitae removal Pat Prom has agreed to provide his equipment to remove bushes with the help of labor from Paul Cress and Dan Ward. Team will remove these dying bushes outside of the chapel and replace them with dirt and grass seed to enable more visibility of the chapel from the outside of the church. Paul to establish a date with the team.
- 3. Pew cleaning and refinishing This task has been put on hold until pandemic issues are under control.
- **4. Staff changes** Ken's Director position has been divided into two manager jobs: an officer manager that has been filled by promotion of Deb Hemann (Hiring replacement for Deb's former Support role) and a building manager. Interviewing a potential Building Mgr this week. Limited responses to postings to date. IT, mail crew and front desk volunteers will now fall under the new office manager's responsibilities.
- 5. IT Update (Servers) Servers location discussions in process. US Internet proposal under review and less than expected cost, so may actually be equal or less than in-house sourcing and this option provides off site safety. In addition, US Internet is expected to provide a substantial improvement in Customer service and friendliness. May create a bit longer log in for two roles (Andrea and Evan) but expect to limit their delays with a work around plan. US Internet was/is recommended by our consultant who Pax has relied upon for almost two decades. This Consultant is in the process of ending his service with other Clients, so eventually may need another such provider.
- 6. IT Update (Other) Power outage caused video issues, Correction incomplete but underway. Awaiting delivery of a distribution amp that is expected to correct the issue. A sound issue was resolved with a single, short cable replacement. Some Pax Mass volume issues have been noted and ACG members are empowered to advise the Sound Board team, Mass Coordinators, etc., if adjustments are deemed necessary.
- 7. Replacement of terraced area west of social halls on hold The wood is rotting and the area is unsightly. The existing terrace and steps must be removed, redone, and landscaped. A number of possibilities exist for improving this area. Tish emphasized the importance of safety and tying the area into the new gardens. She also mentioned the search for a tree trunk sculptor to design an image of St. Clare in a garden. The group decided to table this terrace project for now as it needs further planning and may take a year or two to complete.

Topic: Gardening Planning Discussion and Updates

Discussion / Decisions: Campus/Gardening: Pax will be losing its weed control contractor in the near future and will need to be replaced. Tish broached the idea of a "shovel / seeds" group for gardening in the future. Ken said something similar already exists in Flocknote, but it is underutilized. Tom Scheller and Tish will spearhead the gardening needs for the future and hope to hire a gardening coordinator.

Ken agreed to lead a training session at the next meeting on the use and capabilities of Flocknote at Pax. Covid protocols have halted much of the Flocknote associated activity these past months. We still need to follow CDC guidelines with our volunteers and work moving forward.

Kate Hanson met the indoor plant care team of three ladies and reported on their plans to repot some plants requiring the purchase of dirt. Many pots are available in small Facilities building on the north side of Pax. Ken clarified that Pax has Bachman and Gerten's ((put Pax folks on list to buy enabling 15% discount and sales tax exemption) and Home Depot and Menards (tax exempt cards available for use) relationships that will enable their purchases.

Renee and Paul did extensive weed pulling and bush trimming around Pax campus and spread Preen on the completed areas. Paul has several parking lot medians yet to be completed, but is expecting to complete before our next meeting. Ken was supportive of obtaining some matching rock to supplement the areas as needed, to help slow down future weed growth.

Paul has several round pieces of wood received from Tish that he will treat to extend their life and enable them to be used for future garden projects next spring.



Community Council Report: Jeanne reported on the Community Council meeting. Details will be contained in the minutes of the Community Council. Topics of the meeting that were discussed in more detail:

- 1. The Investment Policy change submitted by the Finance Council to update the Risk Tolerance for the General Cash Management Account was passed.
- 2. Areas of parish focus for the next year.
- 3. Jeanne had Zach read a letter that was approved by the CC to be sent to President Biden and Congress on behalf of the parish. Jay suggested that the letter be sent to the specific representatives from Minnesota to give the letter more emphasis. Letter available under the Advocacy tab at https://godsplanet.us/

Sue was instructed to open an account at Vanguard for the General Cash Management Account and start the investment actions as detailed in the September Meeting Minutes.	Sue	Completed by October month end

Topic: Financial Review – Sandy performed the review of the September financials. No exceptions were noted.

Topic: **Quarterly Budget Update** – Sue presented an updated 2021-2022 fiscal year budget based on 1st quarter results and updated projections for remaining nine months of fiscal 2022. Based on the current status of parish operations, Sue is estimating Pax will have a budget surplus of approximately \$190k.

Discussion: Difficult to budget with so many unknowns regarding if or when the parish activities will be allowed to safely be restored based on the COVID pandemic status. The possibility of increasing the Justice Grants was discussed. Currently have budgeted \$170k which is lower than the amount of grants made in fiscal 2021 (grants in 2021 were increased over budgeted amount based on results of operations). Sue will update the budget again for the January 2022 meeting.

Topic: Annual Stewardship Renewal – Sue reported it has been two weeks since the mailing of the Stewardship letters and pledge cards. Sue tracks the first two weeks of responses and compared to the 2020 mailing the "early returns" are running about 12% behind last year's two-week status. Sue will continue to monitor and mail out reminders as necessary to increase the return of pledges.

Topic: **Update on Hiring Ken's Replacement** – Sue shared that one candidate is being interviewed this week and that Cushman Wakefield has been retained to perform the Capital Needs Assessment. Jay emphasized that the representative assigned by Cushman Wakefield to perform the review has experience in reviewing church facilities.

Sue reported the contribution that formed the basis of the Capital Reserve Account (\$1.5m) was received in May 2014. To date ~\$600k has been spent on capital projects, thus \$900k remains from the donor designated contribution. The interest, dividends and capital gains earned on the account have been board designated for capital projects as well. Balance in the Capital Reserve account as of 9/30/2021 is \$1,582,482.

Topic: Investment Review

Discussion: Jeff walked through return results for the month of September and the first quarter respectively:

Stonebridge: -0.06% and -0.08%, Vanguard: -4.98% and 1.10% for a total portfolio return of -1.19% and 0.15% Endowment Fund -2.38% and 0.50%. There were no questions.

Topic: New Business - Three most pressing issues the parish should focus on:

Discussion: Jeanne requested that each council member email her with the 3 topics they feel are most important for the parish to focus on in the next year. Jeanne will compile and submit to the Community Council. Jeanne opened the floor to suggestions. Following is a listing of items suggested:

- Find ways to resume hospitality and social activities such as the Christmas Tea, Canna Dinner, etc.
- Bring choir back to Sunday Masses
- Financial assistance to less fortunate parishes
- Engagement of members; sense of belonging
- On premises education of our youth
- Connectiveness
- Re-engagement of Catholics in the area that have fallen away from the church

Call to Order: Meeting in Room 211 called to order at 7:34 PM by Mary.

Minutes of 9/21/2021 Meeting: Motion to approve by Pat, second by Cecilia; approved.

"Good Neighbor Team" Presentation and Recommendation

Parishioner Craig Pixley made a presentation recommending that Pax Christi create a "Good Neighbor Team" to welcome and assist refugees from Afghanistan (or possibly refugees from Somalia.) This would be in partnership with Arrive Ministries (a refugee resettlement agency based in Richfield and licensed by World Relief, a national agency working with the U.S. State Department.) Arrive Ministries has settled over 11,000 refugees in its 30 years of work. The team would consist of 6 to 10 parishioners who would commit to one year helping and becoming friends with a family of refugees. Many details were explained and also included in three handouts and Craig's written recommendation that had been sent to Council members prior to the meeting. Craig noted that in addition to the Good Neighbor Team, there would be other volunteer opportunities to work with Arrive Ministries. After discussion and questions answered by Craig, the Council enthusiastically agreed to move forward to establish a Good Neighbor Team. Pax Christi members will be invited to participate in a Zoom call with Arrive Ministries on Monday evening, November 29.

Mission-oriented Mask Policy to Promote Justice

A letter from Carol Bishop, Parish Director, was distributed. The letter is in response to the council's request that we adhere to the CDC's recommendations for wearing masks at all Pax liturgies and events. Her letter expressed

appreciation for our concerns, but outlined reasons that masks are recommended but not required at two weekend Masses.

Community Council Request for Input on Pressing Issues at Pax Christi.

Phyllis Olson, Chair of the Community Council, attended tonight's meeting and asked for council members' input on the most pressing issues currently facing Pax Christi. Some of the hopes of the parents were: For kids to be more engaged and not just present, for Sunday evening mass to contain some different things, and to go beyond just text book reading. They also liked the small group dynamics. It would also be great to get input from additional parents who weren't present.

The Alpha Program, that is being used, is working well allowing good participation and sharing. A "Learning how to Pray" segment also went well.

Scott has met with John Reardon regarding rebuilding the youth program. A four step process: 1) Analyze, 2) Process, 3) Assess Results, 4) Revise as needed, is suggested. Additional suggestions are to find ways to invite others in, find more views, and for Scott to put down on paper what he is thinking and to present that for feedback. Gary Shipp extended, to Scott, the assistance of the LFFC in any way that we can help.

Dr. Art Zannoni's presentation, on 10-18-21, of "Encountering the Compassionate God of the Bible", was well received by those in attendance. Attendance was more than the 27, who had RVSP'd.
