A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE BYRON

This past week I was invited to speak to our relatively new Pax Christi Men's Group about how the experience of Catholicism is understood particularly by males. (Full disclosure: as of the time I am writing this the meeting hasn't yet happened.) But the one thing I already know is that neither I nor any other man has the authority or



ability to speak on behalf of the whole masculine gender when it comes to matters of faith and God, nor how that is distinct from the feminine experience. And, unfortunately, that often seems to be a minority opinion these days. We are living in a moment, both locally and internationally, in which various self-anointed experts-few of them trained psychologists and many of them clerics—are happy to step forward in order to offer theories about how genders differ in their encounter with Catholic faith. Perhaps the most offensive to me is the proposal that a group of celibate males, like clergy, have insight to define what is the "feminine genius" in service to our church, without inquiring of any actual females. There is allegiance there to a preemptory theory about what "manhood" and "womanhood" mean both within and outside the church. That's what I'd prefer to call a stereotype or a caricature. I have found it beneficial over the years to carry a healthy skepticism for those who present themselves armed with universal theories about how whole categories of human beings fit in to "God's" intention for life.

None of this is to erase the distinction between male and female, which is entirely biblical and traditional (and biological). But it is to challenge the presumption with which we sometimes dare to define what those categories mean without listening to the stories of actual people, which are many and diverse. I am relatively sure that men and women experience God and faith and church in somewhat distinctive ways, but the only way to determine how that happens is to converse with them, to tell stories both to those who are like us and to those who are not. And the church, of all institutions, has sometimes been famously wrong in its presumptions about defining gender categories throughout the centuries (don't read St. Thomas Aquinas on the definition of "female"), and perhaps still remains so. The only way to find out for sure is to have conversations, not learned lectures or decrees from authority. That is why I'm grateful for the format of this week's men's gathering here at Pax.

As you know, we are living in a time when social presumptions about the meaning of gender are undergoing significant upheaval, and it is important that we be very thoughtful and discerning about how we talk about such things. This means that it must be a more subtle discussion than a facile lumping of "men" or "women" or "LGBTQ" people into a single group and then pronouncing a judgment of "normal" or "abnormal." (With respect to that last group, I wish someone would acknowledge that those five letters do not indicate exactly the same set of issues.) Once again, it all comes back to careful listening, prayer, and shared Holy Spirit wisdom, which is quite different from "what I happen to think or feel." I am glad that our community can be a place of honest and safe exchange as we move forward together toward clarity about these and other issues.
