# **A NOTE FROM** FR BILL MURTAUGH



Liberation: the act of setting someone free from imprisonment, slavery, or oppression; release. –Oxford Dictionary

I recently read A Stroke of Grace. It's the story of Dieter Zander who was a pastor of a large church in Germany during the 1990s. He was young, handsome, and talented, both as a speaker and as a musician. He was often invited to be the keynote speaker at the best conferences. He was also the author of popular books. He was genuinely a good guy, giving his all to bless and inspire others.

Then in 2008, one night while sleeping, Dieter had a stroke. When he awoke, his right hand was useless. He couldn't speak. Music and preaching were gone overnight. His career as a minister was ended. He was alone in his body that once served him, but now seemed to imprison him.

A friend, believing that Dieter's creative personality must still be alive in his limited body, gave him a camera. Soon he let his photographs speak and tell stories that he once was able to express with words.

To pay his bills, he got a job as a crossing guard, and then as an attendant at the grocery store cleaning toilets, collapsing cardboard boxes, and packing expired but still-good food that needed to be sent to food shelves. Over time he regained some of his speech, through long years and great struggle. He said, "Before stroke, I working for God. German man. Working, working, working. Now, I playing with God. Playing, playing. Much better."

It would have been easy for him to be bitter and, most likely, he had stages of anger and grief as he adjusted to his new life. His once successful and interesting life was over, and now he found himself cleaning toilets in a grocery store.

One day, while cleaning a urinal, Dieter felt a voice speaking deep within him. "Urinal holy," the voice said. "Toilet holy. Bathroom holy. Everything holy." The words came to him as a revelation, a revelation from God, and a liberation as well.

*Everything holy.* Dieter learned something few of us know:

We can relax and live in God's limitless grace. To be who we are, where we are, doing what is ours to do through suffering and loss, through disruption and grief, through the way of the cross, is finally to see that everything is holy. And in this way, to be alive and free.

Jesus is the Great Liberator. He leads us and frees us. I do believe. I hope you believe.
