

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE BYRON

Now well into my thirtieth year of priesthood, I must confess that I continue to confront mystery in the apparatus of our local church, one of which is the Minnesota Catholic Conference (MCC). The MCC is a lobbying organization at the Minnesota legislature. Formerly it was headed by my friend, the late Fr.



Dave McCauley, and I never had the nerve to ask him some important questions because I didn't want to offend him. But now that he's with the Lord, I'll take a stab at it. The website of the MCC describes its work as "the public policy voice of the Catholic church in Minnesota." Its board consists of current and former bishops from the six dioceses in our state. It acts as a proponent for specific legislation, and has a staff of several people, none of whom I ever recall having met.

So here's my question: How can an organization like the MCC advocate for the views of "the Catholic Church in Minnesota" without ever conversing with the Catholic church in Minnesota? I have never been invited by the MCC to share what I think about anything, nor has any community of which I have ever been affiliated. Have you? Our theology and doctrine tell us that the Church is, first and foremost, the People of God, not the People of Influence in the halls of government. I have no idea what or why the MCC decides to prioritize as critical legislative initiatives, but I do recall that it has occasionally backed some that I did not support at all.

It is true that our Catholic bishops are invested with their legitimate role as primary teachers in matters of faith and morals. But there are two problems here. One is that very few—if any—matters of specific civil legislation are thereby matters of "faith." The other is a more theological one; bishops teach with authority because they teach what the Church (i.e. we and our long tradition) believes. It is difficult to understand how that ministry can be carried out without any inquiry into the mind of the actual people who are the living church. For me it is uncomfortable to know that the MCC is representing itself to the legislature as "the public policy voice of the Catholic Church." I have no reason for assurance that this group speaks for me or for us. Why would I?

Last Saturday, the *Star Tribune* ran a feature article about the Joint Religious Legislative Coalition (JRLC), of which the MCC is a part. It praised the uniqueness of an inter-religious collaboration that seems to function amicably in Minnesota as a helpful way to ensure solidarity in matters like child protection, immigrant rights, and interfaith dialogue. Who would disagree with any of that? But none of that resolves the questions that are posed here. What if the MCC were to decide to lobby for something other than these good ends, in our name? To whom is this organization accountable when it presumes to use the moniker of "the Catholic Church in Minnesota?" It is disconcerting to me to know that such representations are made to public officials without the full engagement of us who are the Church.

This is all part of a much larger discussion of how our leaders are accustomed to doing business, a discussion for which Pope Francis is advocating, and which is facing often harsh headwinds. We have a way to go in getting this right.
