## A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE BYRON

Dear Friends:

One of the things for which I've always been grateful in ministry has been the number of opportunities I've had to interface with people "on the margins" (or completely out) of the Church. I didn't plan



it that way, and I'm not sure why it has worked out that way, but I have regularly found myself in encounters with those whose experience of institutional Catholicism has been painful, frustrating, alienating or angering. Needless to say, we have had more than a little experience with those dynamics in recent months and years. Conversations with such people don't threaten me, and in fact they truly engage me because I want to understand better how to be a hospitable presence among those who cannot find solace in our Church. Quite a lot of my good friends are either hardened religious cynics or loyal to other religious traditions—or to none. (I shouldn't presume to speak here for Fr. Bill, but I suspect that he would echo many of these sentiments from his own ministerial experience.)

It seems to me that one of the great tests of a gospel commitment is the capacity to engage respectfully with people—Christian or otherwise—with whom we seem to have very little common ground. What an excellent opportunity to discover together what is true and how our shared human concerns can carry us forward. I do not understand what benefit there is in people and organizations who devote their passions to being defensive about the Catholic church or accusatory toward those who find fault with it. In spite of its many evident shortcomings, I am a very contented Catholic and I do not feel personally offended by the uncharitable dispositions of some others toward my community of faith. It's grounded in Jesus Christ, after all, not us, and Jesus can take some flack when necessary.

You don't have to study much Church history to recognize how early and often it has been the instinct of Christians to need to define one's faith primarily by demonizing those who don't share it. It begins right on the pages of the New Testament, particularly the Gospel of John, and the most frequently targeted enemy in the book appears to be "the Jews." That gospel was written within a century after Jesus' resurrection, by which time it appears to have been forgotten that Jesus was never anything other than Jewish until the day he died. He was never engaged in battle against his own religious tradition. And throughout the centuries it is easy to see how virulently the Jews were vilified in Christian preaching, including that from some of our canonized saints. These days many seem to have moved on to targeting the followers of Islam as the subjects of disdain, a sad reality which hits very close to home here in the southwest metro area. We here at Pax Christi are capable of being the "NO" response to that sort of thing, and we witness to that regularly, thankfully.

It's Lent now, and perhaps one act of generous self-discipline in which we can engage this season is conscious hospitality toward those who are "other." Jesus would do as much.
