## A NOTE FROM FR BILL MURTAUGH

I'd like to share a short reflection that I recently read. It was written by an Irish priest, and I believe it will open our minds and hearts as we listen to the famous parable of The Prodigal Son this weekend.

Father Alan was visiting an elderly woman whose son had been dead for quite a while, and she spoke about him a lot. Every



conversation about him seemed unfinished; something ran deep but was left unsaid. Finally, it came out. Her son had lived a "colorful" life. He had traveled the world before a strange hereditary disease took him from her. She missed him, but more than missing him, she wondered where he was, where his soul was. Father Alan had spoken with her a few times, but during this visit he felt the need to push the conversation a bit.

He asked her if she was worried about him. In true Irish style she didn't answer the question directly. Instead she said he had lived life to the fullest when he was alive.

Then Father Alan asked, "When did the father forgive the Prodigal Son?"

She looked at him and chided him, "I'm no theologian. I don't know about that!"

Father responded, "But you are a mother and that certainly helps. Go on then, when did the father forgive the son?"

"When he saw him coming to the house?"

"Try again." Father Alan told her.

"When he said sorry?"

"Maybe, but try again."

"When he hugged him?" and then she said sternly, "and that's my final answer!" Then she looked at Father Alan and said, "What's your answer smarty-pants?"

To which he said, "I don't think he ever forgave him!"

"What do you mean?" she asked. She stuttered and stammered, protesting and pontificating like mad. She couldn't get her head around what Father Alan was saying. Eventually she quieted down through frustration and anger.

"I don't think he ever forgave him because, well because he never needed to. I don't think he ever condemned him in the first place."

The mother's silence went deeper and she sat up carrying a peace that seemed to catch her unexpectedly. She knew immediately what Father Alan had meant.

Father Alan concludes that when you peel back the idea of God's mercy in the stories and actions of Jesus, we are told that God's mercy is richer and deeper than any human concept of mercy and forgiveness.
