God on a cross? According to the gospel narrative, those who passed before Jesus crucified, jeered at him and mocked his helplessness saying to him: "If you are the Son of God, come down from that cross." Jesus did not react to the provocation. His



answer is a silence charged with mystery. Because He is the Son of God, He remains on the cross until He dies. Of course, we have questions. How is it possible for God to be crucified by man? Do we realize what we are thinking? What is God doing on the cross? How can a religion based on such an absurd notion survive?

A crucified God forces us to revise our thinking of a God whom we supposedly know. A crucified God has neither the appearance nor the characteristics that all the world religious attribute to the Supreme Being.

A crucified God is not an all-powerful majestic being, unchangeable and happy, a stranger to our sufferings, or deaf to our cries, but a helpless and humiliated God who suffers pain, anguish, and even death with us. Faced with the cross, we either renounce our faith in God, or we open our minds to a new and amazing understanding of a God who became like us in our suffering, who loves us with a love we will never completely comprehend.

As we look upon the crucified Christ, we begin to sense that God, in God's mysterious depths, is someone who suffers with us. Our miseries move God. Our sufferings affect God. God is not one who is untouched by our sorrow, tears, and misfortune. God is present at every crucifixion in this world. This crucified God does not admit of a frivolous selfish faith in an all-powerful God who serves our whims and fancies. This God forces us to face the suffering, the neglect, and the abandonment of so many victims of injustice and misfortune. This is the God we will meet whenever we come close to anyone who is crucified.

We are faced with a crucified God. But what about those crucified before our eyes? To celebrate the Passion of the Lord Jesus in a true spirit as His followers, we must rekindle our compassion. Without this compassion our faith in the crucified God will run the risk of being false in so many ways. When we kiss the cross on Good Friday, let our eyes be focused on all those close to or far away from us who suffer.
