

# A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE BYRON



Dear Friends:

It is Easter, and as I am writing this, I am watching surreal scenes on TV of fire devastating Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris. If there is any Catholic icon in Europe that is a symbol of stability, deep history, astonishing beauty, and profound faith, it must be that building. I have never seen it in person, but it is bewildering and heartbreaking to think of its demise in the course of a day. Amid all the threats and triumphs of centuries in Western Civilization, Notre Dame has stood... until this week.

Surely this tragedy is so upsetting in large part because it reminds us vividly of how fragile our own existences are, and our imagined permanent human treasures, at every moment of life. All the things that we think of as enduring and as "too big to fail" in this world once were not and one day will be no more. That would be the most sobering news of all were it not for faith in the Resurrection.

There was no greater treasure that ever entered human history than Jesus Christ—no person who ever passed among us holding out such hope and promise for eternal bliss with God. And He died. More exactly, He was executed. And the heavens joined with all the people in shuddering against the horror of it all. This Messiah was our last best hope to set things right among ourselves and with our Maker, and suddenly He came to nothing in a few hours' time, eliminated at the hands of hostile human beings.

And then came Easter morning, when all expectations seem to have been crushed, but something utterly mind-boggling and inexplicable happened: Jesus was encountered alive again, raised up by God. This is our story ever since, and the reason for our joy today. Easter really doesn't make much sense unless and until we have come face to face with the tragic side of our human story, the losses of things that we relied upon to bring us lasting peace, the institutions, buildings, relationships, loves, health, jobs, finances...all of it. It is only when all of those false Gods fail us that we can truly understand what a miracle is Easter.

We will survive the tragedy of Notre Dame because it was never God, no matter how much it led us in God's direction since the Middle Ages. May the celebration of this miracle day be a blessing!
