
#### **ON-SITE 12-STEP SUPPORT GROUPS:**

# A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE BYRON



Dear Friends:

In this Easter season of new life, it is helpful to think ahead toward our own new life with God. But, as we have seen through the Triduum liturgies, that involves first a confrontation with the reality of death, as it did for Jesus. There's no getting to eternity without the grave, and we do well to prepare ourselves as best we can for it. That doesn't have to be a maudlin task...just an honest one.

Our cultural response to dying and death has been evolving rapidly over the past several years. It used to be kind of automatic that when the end of a life came you called the funeral director, got the casket, went to church, and put the deceased person's body into a grave in a cemetery. Today none of those things is a given. Cremations have now become very much a part of the process, and are rapidly becoming more usual, including among Catholics. There's nothing wrong with that, but it changes the nature of the leave-taking. Also, a new generation of people are opting out of church services for themselves and for their parents. That's significant and regrettable, in my opinion, and worthy of some thought (and pre-planning). It is not rare today for life-long Catholics not to be honored with a Catholic funeral because their kids don't practice the faith and either don't want to be in church or don't know how to engage the rituals. And sometimes the remains don't get buried at all. If any of this matters to you, I'd like to invite you, your loved ones, and your friends and neighbors to a gathering on Wednesday, May 8, here at Pax Christi.

We've called the gathering, "What To Know Before You Go," which is a name we stole (with his permission) from Scott Mueller, who's a friend of mine and who recently wrote a book with that same title. Scott is a second-generation Catholic funeral director from St. Paul, and he will join me at this gathering to address some of the most important practical questions that people confront when they are anticipating their own death or the death of a loved one: How much does it cost? What is required by law? What can I do in advance to minimize the stress at the time of the event? What are the options for disposition of remains? Scott's book will be available for purchase in case you are interested. I have found it very helpful. (It's also on Amazon.com in case you can't make it to the event.)

My part of the evening will involve a brief reflection on why it is important for people of faith to engage in the rituals of Christian burial when a life comes to an end. Our esteem for the treasure of human beings, body and spirit, ought to call out of us a solemn recognition for what God has given us and for what has now, for a time, been taken from us. We need our rituals of transition at important moments of life/ death, and a funeral is certainly among the most important of those.
