# A NOTE FROM FR BILL MURTAUGH

Before I forget ...

A few months ago someone asked me to visit a lady who told her doctor she had no reason to go on living. As someone once said, "Be tender with the young, with the aged, sympathetic with the striving, and



tolerant of the weak and wrong, because at some time in our lives we've been or we will have been all of these." That's a lesson we should learn and re-learn many times.

When I entered her room, she was resting wide awake. She seemed relieved to see me and eager to share her thoughts. I pulled up a chair and she told me of her marriage of sixty-plus years. Her husband had died a few months earlier.

"My life is over and for the life of me I don't know why God still has me here." Over the years I've wised up, a little, to realize that people sometimes make statements that are really questions in disguise. She wasn't quite ready to give up. As we say, the well was deep and dark but she was still hoping for a rope. It would be a difficult climb. As I left her room I had the feeling she might be ready to start, at least in her own way and time.

This life is a running commentary on those who search for hope and struggle to survive their adversities, with varying degrees of success. Our fourteenth president was one such example. Franklin Pierce, a one-term president (1853-1857) who battled alcoholism for much of his life, hardly evoked confidence as a leader. He was handily elected, but from that point on, his life took a downward spiral. As he began his presidency, Pierce's speech was grim and forgettable. His wife was a no-show. Two months earlier, his 11-year-old son died tragically in a train accident. Worse yet, they had already buried their first two sons. With his troubled marriage and policy blunders, he turned to alcohol. A second term was out of the question. He eventually died, essentially from alcoholism, in 1869. Everyone needs to know there's a better way and that we're not alone.

Next weekend the Church celebrates the feast of Christ's Ascension to the Father. He said, "I will not leave you orphans" (John 14:18). He promised to never "ration the gift of the Spirit" (John 3:34). For God is no glory hound, as Jesus' life shows us from beginning to end. He even promised to "prepare a place for us" (John 14: 2) and that He and the Father would make their home in each of us (John 14:23). His appearances would end even as His power would be unleashed.

We read two accounts of the Ascension, both by Luke. Both accounts emphasize another promise made by Christ, namely, that we would be His empowered witnesses. And how do we do that? By being there for others in the hard climb of life. We can't do the heavy lifting for them but our love in Christ can show them the way out.
