A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE BYRON

Dear Friends:

I was stunned to learn that three of our parishioners, Carmen, husband Martin, and son Alann, were abruptly picked up by agents of our government (ICE) last week, and that the couple is being deported to Mexico immediately. These are members of the Pax Christi Community, none of



them criminals, and all of them on their way to work when ICE swept in. This happened in Eden Prairie, in our parish. Carmen and Martin aren't just members here. They have been significant organizers of our annual feast day celebration of Our Lady of Guadalupe in December. Four generations of their family have now been traumatized and separated by this single event, and I wouldn't have heard anything about it if Alann and his wife had not asked to speak with me after Mass last weekend. The inhumaneness of the whole episode is unspeakable, and yet somebody has to speak of it. I do not hear outrage from the vast majority of Christian public leaders, Catholic or otherwise, about what is happening to actual human beings and families, even though the facts are quite public. And I can think of fewer more antithetical practices to the gospel of Jesus Christ. What is it that we and other churches stand for if not for the protection of families?

This column is not intended as a guilt trip for us all, but it is intended as an alarm that we may be becoming desensitized to acts and speech of basic human cruelty because it has become so common in recent years, often with public approbation. It was just several weeks ago that we were made aware of large numbers of immigrant children separated from parents and living in cages in our country, also under the auspices of our government. For a moment there was shock and horror, and then a sort of "new normal" seemed to set in. I have felt it too. It's like losing a chunk of one's Christian soul through silence, and I think I'm right to be a little afraid of that. By now it is apparent that we will not be getting any moral clarity from most of our public officials any time soon, so it is our responsibility to be focused on the gospel that we serve whenever we gather for worship.

When the God of the Judeo-Christian tradition speaks in the Scriptures about sin and unfaithfulness, the list usually begins with offenses committed against the most helpless ones—the widow, the orphan, the "alien" (i.e. migrant), and the stranger in our midst. That is basic to our understanding of the moral life, so if we seem unclear or unconvinced of it, then I would reiterate the fear that I just mentioned. I am unwilling to hand over my soul for the sake of a false civic serenity and public silence. That doesn't make me a hero, but just what seems to be an obvious requirement of my religion. Real people, now including our own parishioners, are being deliberately set upon and made to suffer as the result of specific decisions that human beings have chosen to make (in our name). The teachings of Jesus Christ have been conspicuously absent from the public deliberations about all this, and if we don't make mention of that fact, then it is evident that others won't either.
