## A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE BYRON



Dear Friends:

This past week brought the death of our former archbishop, Harry J. Flynn, who led this archdiocese for about a dozen years

until his retirement in 2007. It was an often tumultuous tenure for him, and he would frequently say that if he had his life to live over again, "I'd spend every day as a priest but not one of them as a bishop." I think he meant that. Archbishop Flynn had his limitations and weaknesses, as we all do, but I don't think I ever met a more gracious, kind, and compassionate man—even amid all of the pressures of his ministry. He was unfailingly kind to me and to my parents, especially at the time of their deaths. I last saw him about 18 months ago at a restaurant in St. Paul, dining with some other priests. When he saw me he immediately came over to the table to say hello, and when I stood up to greet him he politely demanded that I sit right back down. He tended to be formal in his manners, but didn't demand that from others in return.

Archbishop Flynn also had a great sense of humor. About 20 years ago I was invited to a Christmas party at the home of some parishioners in Richfield. I had no idea that he'd be part of the guest list, and when I walked into the house, he arose and said, "Hello Fr. Byron, it's such a pleasure to see you." One of the other guests there looked at him blankly and said, "What's up with this 'Father Byron?' Hell, this is 'Little Mikey." Ever afterward when I'd see the archbishop he would tell me that he thought "Little Mikey" was a perfect name for me, and that he intended to use it henceforth.

I have often reflected on his telling of the story of how he became a bishop. He was a priest in the diocese of Albany, New York, and was called one day by the Vatican's Apostolic Nuncio to request that he agree to take on this new role. He didn't want to, and at first he said no. Then the nuncio called back and explained to him that this was Jesus Christ inviting him to take on the role of bishop, and so he relented. I am aware that I am a bit jaded in some respects about church institutions, but it struck me that Archbishop Flynn was able to be persuaded that the desires of the Roman Curia and the will of Jesus Christ could be conflated to be the same thing. He was unquestionably a "man of the church," perhaps to a fault sometimes, and he submitted in obedience to do what was being asked of him. I don't think I could have done that (and don't worry, the occasion will never present itself).

He made a lot of friends among us and decided to live out his final years in Minnesota rather than at his cabin in the mountains of his native eastern New York. I count it a true blessing to have known him, as I'm sure many of you do, too. May he rest well in God's peace.
