A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE BYRON

Dear Friends:

As you probably know, we celebrate a lot of funerals here at Pax in the course of a year—somewhere between about 45 and 60. They are all sacred, unique,



and requiring of our best hospitality, particularly from our amazing volunteers who procure and provide the luncheons afterward. We are really blessed to have such generosity among us.

At many of those funeral liturgies, a family member or friend elects to offer some brief words of remembrance in public (a.k.a. a eulogy). I've observed over the course of time that those remarks generally can fall in to one of two types. One type is the recitation of specific memories about activities that the deceased person engaged in and shared with loved ones. There are recalled family fishing trips or vacations or holiday rituals, which is fine, but not very compelling for people who weren't there. The second type is a reflection about how this person's life witness changed the people around him/her because of the things they valued and encouraged in others. Since I often have not had a personal history with the one who died, I am far more engaged with this second type of remembering. It is inspiring to hear about how someone's sense of faith or generosity or hospitality or self-sacrifice had an impact on those who looked to her/him to be a living witness about how to be in the world. In that sense, every human being is a teacher, or what we Catholics would call a sacrament—a visible disclosure of what God's love actually looks like when it is enfleshed in the here and now. At least that is our opportunity when we do it relatively well. And we have a new chance to commit ourselves to that great purpose every single day.

Recently I had a conversation with an old college friend who told me of enduring, life-long emotional trauma inflicted by schoolteachers from his early childhood—people who were cruel and shaming and angry and vindictive to children. That's the power that teachers hold, whether they are competent in their subject area or not. I was grateful to be able to respond that my experiences in school were entirely different. I recall little of the specific data that was imparted to me by those teachers, but I very well remember the ones who were kind and forgiving and encouraging. (I'm sure they weren't all competent!)

I'm mentioning all of this because it is the start of a new year of faith formation here at Pax Christi, and I am aware that the greatest gift that our catechists and formators can offer to our learners—children or adult— is the gift of themselves and their life witness and their sincerity in the desire to share their quest for God. Thank you to all of them.
