# A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE BYRON

Back in the days when I was teaching graduate students in theology at the University of St. Thomas, one of the courses that I was assigned to direct was titled, "Christian Theology of God." I regularly used to ponder the preposterousness of



me, or anyone, presuming to step up to teach anybody about the topic of "God" in twelve easy weeks. Who exactly dares to do that? And who should trust an alleged scholar who dares to do that? It's actually an ancient question that was perhaps best handled by the wise St. Thomas Aquinas about 800 years ago. It was he who recognized that the minute anybody presumes to ascribe human words to a discussion about God, he/she has already begun to get it wrong.

So, where does that leave us? With nothing to say at all? No, that's not it. St. Thomas said that we merely need to be appropriately humble about the limitations of the words we use when we attempt to speak about matters of The Divine. We can indeed speak of things that are true about God, so long as we are aware that such speech is not univocal (i.e. not to be understood literally in the same way that we speak about earthly things). The words we use are, rather, what he called "analogical." For example, he taught that it is absolutely correct to speak of God as "Father," provided that we begin by recognizing the fact that God is not a father in exactly the same sense that we human beings understand that word. The same holds true for any other name that we attempt to pin on God (like the scriptural titles of "King" or "Lord" or "Master") from our own relatively poor powers of language. Words are necessary to name what is real, but they immediately have the effect of constricting our imaginations about what we think we are talking about, at least when we are talking about God.

OK, by now this has started to become a really cerebral and perhaps boring theology lesson, but I think it's important for all of us to remember because of the frequency with which a whole lot of people tend to think that they've got the idea of "God" (and by extension "God's Will") nailed down in a theory or a political platform or a moral agenda or a Code of Canon Law. It's easy to do, and it's not adequate to capture the One who is, in fact, our God. Even to quote the beautiful psalm which proclaims that "The Lord is Kind and Merciful" is, as St. Thomas would be quick to remind us, not entirely correct. God is not a "Lord" as earthlings understand that term, nor is His kindness and mercy just like the quality of human goodness that we experience here and now. It's all bigger than that. That's really the essence of what it means to speak of God as Holy Mystery. So how about a bit of humility here?

Heading into an election year shortly, the minute you hear the words "God" or "God's Will" attached to any politician or political party or platform, my advice would be to run away and to pray deeply for wisdom.
