A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE BYRON

Dear Friends:

Today's liturgical feast is a profound paradox for me. In the Church's calendar it is officially named, "Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe." Few may be aware that it is a very recent creation in our Church, declared by Pope Pius XI not



even a century ago. We used to just call it "Christ the King." The "of the Universe" part was added to the prayer books within the past several years. And the paradox is that the title of "King" is one that Jesus expressly declined to accept for himself in the scriptures when He was given the opportunity to do so—most notably in a direct question from Pontius Pilate. He implicitly allowed Peter to get away with calling Him "Messiah" in answer to the question, "Who do you say I am?" And He was willing to be known as "Lord" and "Master" among His friends on the night of the Last Supper in John's gospel. But not "King." One can only speculate on the reason for that, but I have my own suspicions why, informed by the bible.

It's because of our associations with the idea of kingship. Kings (and Queens) tend in our imaginations (and in our historical experience) to be aristocrats of privilege, aloof, removed from the drama and dust of the everyday lives of actual people. They wield weapons of destruction and march off to war against adversaries. And they relate to their own citizens as "subjects" rather than as peers or friends. They are benevolent autocrats at best, and brutal dictators at worst. They live in palaces and castles and they don't respond to emails. Our concerns are not much theirs.

It is not that the title of "Christ the King" is incorrect. It is rather that we are very, very likely to misunderstand the implications of that title. There was, in fact, the inscription over Jesus' head while hanging on the cross that read, "Jesus the Nazarene, King of the Jews." But that inscription was not put there by Jesus. It was, in fact, meant to be a sarcastic insult from His executioners, mocking the claims of His followers that He was descended from royalty. If you Google up images of Christ the King on your computer, you will find, overwhelmingly, portraits of a man wearing not a crown of thorns but a crown of gold, not dressed in a loincloth but often dressed in liturgical vestments or regal robes, not with open hands but with hands clutching swords, not suffering but gloriously seated on a throne. This is where we go wrong. Jesus is, in fact, our King, but He spent His whole ministry among us trying to cure us of the misunderstanding of what real power looks like in practice on earth. He is not our King because He is the embodiment of the Windsors of England multiplied by twenty. Exactly the opposite, in fact, if scripture is to be believed.

Why does any of this matter? Because it directly affects how we think about what it means to be a church in service to this King. It does not mean being bigger, more powerful, more dominant, more esteemed, more violent, and more wealthy than the lesser king next door. You will search the gospels in vain for any such witness. So by all means, let us acknowledge and celebrate the supreme power of Christ our King, but let us not forget what that really means and what it demands of us.
