A NOTE FROM FR BILL MURTAUGH

November Reflection...

No one should ever say faith is easy. Some of the greatest saints knew that better than most.

The phrase "dark night of the soul" is



sometimes used to describe a crisis in our relationship with God. It is often associated with the writings of St. John of the Cross, a Carmelite friar who lived in Spain during the sixteenth century and who knew how difficult it could be to stay on the journey of faith. He wasn't alone. St. Therese of Lisieux also spoke of her own struggles with her "dark night of the soul." In our times, Mother Teresa of Calcutta is said to have similar difficulties over the last half of her life, according to her letters released in 2007.

It is important to know that it is not unusual to experience such feelings; however, it is important to treat them as opportunities in which we seek a deeper knowledge of God and God's will for us. Good Friday was a "dark night of the soul" for Jesus dying on the cross.

The Bible has many examples of women and men of faith questioning and searching...Elijah, that lively prophet of the ninth century BC, is a good example. Elijah knew what it was like to become disillusioned. In his desperation he withdrew to the desert, overwhelmed by a sense of failure. He believed he had been God's only hope, and that his best efforts had been in vain. And not only was he a failure, but so were those who had gone before him. Those prophets before him had worked and witnessed and died in the service of God, but seemed to accomplish little. It's worth noting how Elijah's exchange with God ends, there in the lonely desert: God touched him and provided for his renewal and spiritual rejuvenation. It wasn't up to him after all; God was still in control.

Some of us Catholic Christians probably feel like Elijah today as we look at our Church and its future: declining attendance and an aging membership. Parents in particular are bound to feel sad when their children and grandchildren opt out of church life. There are signs, however, that a religion of convention is giving way to a religion of conviction and commitment! This will happen wherever the Church is faithful to Jesus Christ rather than itself, and wherever people are living rather than only discussing their faith.

The "dark night" is not only a religious issue. Going through bereavement, disappointment, failure, old age-these and countless other human experiences can overwhelm us in a "dark night." All these experiences confront us with our human limitations, raise fundamental questions on human existence, and contain a challenge to accept our vocation as human beings. We need to remember in our "dark nights" that God is always there for us, always loving us. God uses every occasion to illuminate usand God's illumination can often be perceived as darkness.

Life is always a process of becoming. We are always *becoming* Christians until the day we die!
