A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE BYRON

Dear Friends:

I have always appreciated the wisdom of whomever it was who once said that "the evidence of an intelligent person is the ability to make distinctions." That's nowhere more true than in the realm of religion, and more specifically in the



reading of the bible. I've been reading a new book this week that attempts to correlate some basic Judeo-Christian claims of faith with the fact that our world view today is very, very different from the one that informed the authors of Scripture.

Let me try to be less vague here. To the question, "Is the bible true?" the answer can only be yes. But then we have to begin to make distinctions, like, "In what sense is the bible true?" Well, that depends upon which book you are reading. History books (of which there are several in the bible) tell truth in a more-or-less literal narrative fashion. Folklore and fables (of which there are also several scriptural examples) tell truth in a different way. For example, was Jonah actually swallowed up by a giant fish and spit out on shore a couple of days later? Probably not. That doesn't make the story less "true" from a faith perspective. It just means that you have to know what kind of literature you are reading, and how to discern the truth that it contains. Symbolic stories (what the scholars call "apocalyptic") tell truth in still another way, through signs and dreams and visions, like the book of Revelation or Daniel or Ezekiel. The letters of St. Paul are just that letters between human beings—and they mean pretty much exactly what they say (though almost certainly not all of them were actually written by Paul.) Poetry, like the book of Psalms, is not read the same way as the daily newspaper.

My reading this week focused on the story of the so-called "Original Sin" story of Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden, at the very beginning of the book of Genesis. Putting aside the fact that there was nobody else there in the garden to take notes on the unfolding of events, does the truth of that story lie in the insistence upon a talking snake and a fruit tree? Some Christians would say that it does, but for Catholics it is not necessary to hold that opinion. We can make intelligent distinctions here, which not only don't undermine the truth of the story but actually make it more credible.

Why this matters is that all of us are given the responsibility in baptism to be sharers of the faith that we hold. We are to be evangelizers, especially to a younger generation. But that does not mean handing them a bible and telling them that they have to believe every word of it as if it were literal narrative history. Some of it is. Some of it isn't. To require that others put faith in stories that are quite evidently unbelievable on a descriptive level is to do positive harm to our mission. So, let's make some distinctions.
