Call to Order: Meeting called to order at 5:30 pm by Phyllis Olson

Opening Prayer: Mary Lillicrap

Approve Last Month Minutes: Moved to accept by Mary Frances Messer, seconded by Mary Lanners

1. Topic: Council Goals for Re-engaging the Community

Discussion: Phyllis Olson

- Phyllis had shared the lists of ideas for re-engagement generated by all the ministry councils. Phyllis
 noted that she was struck by "how much we all missed each other" during our restricted pandemic
 times.
- Sunday hospitality will resume once our large new coffee makers arrive, meaning it will likely be the last weekend of March. Karen suggested that councils could host hospitality in these initial weeks before summer. Next year, we will be inviting the many ministry groups from Pax to each take a weekend to host hospitality share in serving their fellow parishioners. It also gives each group a chance to highlight their ministry.

- Phyllis noted that small groups have been suggested among the ideas as well as in other conversations
 around the parish. Shari noted that small groups existed at Pax in years past, organized based on
 neighborhoods and groups met in homes. Phyllis encouraged members to let her or Carol know if
 anyone on their ministry council would like to help on a small group task force with a goal of getting
 small groups going in the fall.
- Phyllis asked council members to share the ideas with their ministry councils and that each council pick one or more items to focus on as a goal so that each council is contributing to the common priority of engagement. Phyllis also cited the February parish retreat as a good example of teamwork across departments and councils. She encouraged councils to consider collaborating on ideas when it makes sense. Fr. Mike also noted that councils can bring forth the goal or vision for an engagement initiative, but we can always invite other parishioners to help in planning or organizing an event.
- It was suggested that councils might need more than one night to select an engagement goal. Councils should manage the discussion such that they can bring their goal back to the community council.

2. Topic: Priority #3 – Outreach Discussion: Phyllis Olson

- Phyllis reminded members that at the last meeting that Outreach was identified as the possible #3 priority of the council, but it was agreed that we needed to define what we mean by outreach.
- Phyllis notes that Outreach often refers to charity and justice activities such as Twelve Baskets, our work with PROP, Loaves and fishes and other local charities with whom Pax is engaged.
- Outreach can also mean growing our vitality through outreach of relationship: building relationships within our parish community as well as outside of our parish community.
- To better help us define what we mean; Phyllis raised the question of the purpose of our outreach outside of Pax Christi. Shari stated that such outreach efforts help to make people aware of our presence, such as with the Interfaith Thanksgiving prayer service that we were part of prior to the pandemic.
- Patricia commented that some of what we do is to be of service; to be a gift to others. Bruce noted that the term "outreach" came from trying to stay away from the word evangelization. Outreach is, in part, to bring seeking people to God.
- Phyllis asked the council how we would activate outreach as a goal. If we make it a priority, what does it look like?
- Some suggested social activities in the parking lot for the community, such as food trucks for an event.
- Karen noted that Hermes Cervantes had previously done some research on food trucks and will report on those learnings.
- Fr. Mike commented that Jesus is the reason we do Outreach. To bring Jesus into the community around us through our service, our witness, our actions and our love. He suggested that perhaps we need other church partners in this effort, but noted that clergy interaction is limited in these post-pandemic times.
- Other community-based initiatives were mentioned such as hosting a blood drive or returning to offering "Fair for All." Patricia offered to follow-up on the status of Fair for All.

3. Topic: Leadership Calling Discussion: Phyllis Olson

We have launched our lay leadership calling for this year. Nomination forms were made available for ministry council chairs and they were encouraged to invite their councils to nominate potential candidates. We hope to recruit 25 people to help fill out councils. Council members are encouraged to participate in "Meet & Greet" opportunities:

- March 30th at 7:00 pm via Zoom
- April 3rd at 10:00 a.m. in the Mother Teresa room after 9:00 am Mass

4. Topic: Reports from Pastor and Parish Director Discussion: Fr. Mike Byron and Carol Bishop

- Fr. Mike reported that he recently toured, presided and preached at St. Hubert's school and had a very positive experience. Eden Prairie students can get free bussing to St. Hubert's. There may be an opportunity for ongoing support and collaboration between our two parishes as we each strive to form our children and youth in faith.
- Fr. Mike also commented on the ongoing needs for anointing and funerals. It is a major element of his ministry at Pax and can be overwhelming to his schedule at times.
- Carol noted that the council should discuss what our expectations are for leadership meetings next program year. We have become accustomed to Zoom and hybrid meetings in the past two years. Do we want to encourage in-person meetings for councils so that we build relationships and are together once/month, or should each council determine the best format for their meetings? We should also determine whether the meeting schedule would change if/when, we return to dinner together.
- It has been recommended that we postpone dinner together until May, but that the April meeting will be live and we will pray together in the church at 7:00 p.m.

2. Topic: Finance Director Report

Discussion: Sue Fier

- <u>Ukraine relief</u>: The Archdiocese is recommending we direct parishioners to the Catholic Relief Services website (related to assistance for the Ukraine). We will include a link in the eNEWS next week. Caritas is an organization that will carry out the relief on behalf of Catholic Relief Services.
- <u>Justice Grants Board</u> is meeting right now. We spent \$200k this year on Justice Grants and decisions are being made on how that will be allocated. We will have to pull \$150k out of Stonebridge in May to cover.
- <u>Staffing Updates</u>: Jean's position is still open, and interviews are ongoing. We lost tech support recently so we have hired a company called CyberAdvisors that will act as a replacement for that position. The cost for Cyber Advisors will be a \$1,750 onboarding fee and then a \$1,525 monthly fee this was unbudgeted but is a partial replacement for Ken's position.
- <u>Unemployment</u>: We received a letter from the State of Minnesota stating that the billing will begin again in April. We have incurred \$37,249 during the pandemic but federal and state pandemic relief programs have forgiven all except for \$1,628. We have an accrued liability on the books for \$16,700 that will be reversed when the final bill is received.
- <u>Budgeting</u>: We will begin this at the end of March and will take the most recent 12 months of financial data (4/1/2021 thru 3/31/2022) as the starting point. Meetings will take place with all the directors for

their input. A FY 2022-23 proposed budget will be presented to the Finance and Development Council during the May meeting and then to the Community Council for final approval during their June meeting.

- Agreed Upon Procedures Engagement: We will be need an agreed upon procedures engagement for fiscal year ending June 30, 2022, last one was 6/20/2018. They focus a lot on internal controls.
 Approved CPA firms for the engagement are, Boulay, CLA, Boyum and Barenscheer.
- Money counting: We have one new money counter and 4 total teams

3. Topic: Recruiting

Discussion: Jeanne Roffee

There are going to be some events at church that help foster recruitment. A live meet and greet event will be happening on 4/3 between masses. 3/30 meet and greet will be at 7pm and virtual. A suggestion was made to discuss rotating councils to do a "show and tell". We need to start thinking about who can fill the shoes of our 3 members roll off.

4. Topic: Investment Review

Discussion:

- Jeff reported on the ME February results
- Jeanne had requested a yield number and we can only pull this quarterly because of the functions that are available to us. Jeanne brought up that people who are not familiar with fixed income may think there is a negative connotation with these negative total return numbers, and there may be a more accurate way to represent how our investments are truly doing. Mark had the idea that our investments are outperforming the stock market so if there were a way to make that comparison, people may feel more comfortable. Sue brought up that most parishioners would only look at these numbers annually so our current process may be ok as is.
- Stonebridge return: -.7%
- Vanguard: -3.68%
- Blended: -1.26%
- Endowment fund: -1.27%
- Vanguard complaint update we haven't received a letter back

5. Topic: Catholic Community Foundation Investment Conference Discussion: Jerry Marick

- The keynote speaker presented a lot of valuable information that Sue sent out to all of us. One of the themes is that they seem to be optimistic about a recovery in the next couple of years.
- The Catholic Community Foundation manages the Pax Christi Community Endowment Fund.

6. Topic: Reengagement ideas

- Jeanne wanted our thoughts on the ideas shared, Lindsey said small groups for married couples, and Jay said something after mass. It was decided that all members should re-read the list in detail and decide what their top choices would be. Our council will have to report out on what we think is the most important or best idea from the list.

 can pick the vendors you would like and then you need to invite them. Insurance was mentioned as an
 issue in the past. Karen to contact Grace Church to identify the process and their experience with food
 trucks on site.
- Carol mentioned that Koo Koo Kangaroo (kiddy band) is in the works for Sept 24th in the parking lot. More to follow on this one.
- Volunteers, volunteers and volunteers. We need to get more folks involved: from help at our masses, to hospitality after mass, to help with engagement plans, etc., Carol to look into uncovering lists in the database.

1. Topic: Community Council: Mary Lanners Discussion: Reengaging the Community. Pax Christi Values: God Centered, Justice, Inclusion, Spiritual Growth, Stewardship, Lay-Leadership.

There were additional suggestions:

- Continue with hospitality after each mass It has been decided to offer hospitality consisting of coffee
 and doughnuts only after the 9:00 and 11:00am Sunday mass. Each Council will be responsible for
 providing a welcome and hospitality. We will continue this conversation in the next meeting.
- Community Council also talked about the idea of bringing food trucks this fall, along with music. At the same time, collecting food for PROP.
- Create or build a Coffee Shop for the youth at Pax. Have them help put it together, run it, name it etc. Work as a community.
- Provide opportunities to engage youth in this project. How do they want this activity and space to look like? Food cart or a designated space?
- Youth interested in service projects Scott Brazil in charge of youth groups.
- Martha wondered if we could find a project, they would like to work on. Joan mentioned that they are going to invite youth to participate on projects related to climate.
- There was the question of age group. We might consider the Confirmation Class group. It will be a win/win situation to work with HS age group. Engage youth in different projects and reward them with pizza after they participate on a project.
