Opening Prayer: Led by Barb Hokanson

Approve Last Month Minutes: Moved to accept minutes by Jeanne Roffee, seconded by Karen Wilder.

1. Topic: Youth Engagement Priority Progress Report Discussion: Led by Scott Brazil

Faith Formation Director, Scott Brazil provided an update on the status of our efforts in youth ministry. Scott used the Alpha program with youth this year which was very well received.

He also engaged youth in the parish retreat, following it with a service/social justice experience for the teens. For Confirmation Scott created interactive sessions with sponsors and candidates together. He has had parents tell them that their kids were talking positively about the year and what they were doing.

What we don't have is the youth staff person in place yet. We reposted the position but have not had new applicants. In the short term, Scott will start doing some planning for next year. He had hoped the new person could join in planning, but now will get started so that if we hire, that person can just step in and get going. Four times next year we'll have a youth-led prayer service at Pax Christi. Each prayer service will have a social justice component, i.e. racial justice around MLK day, Environmental justice around Earth Day.

Scott hopes that the mission trip will inspire more participation. He recognizes that it will take time to build a new approach, gain interest and trust from the teens and engage the parish.

2. Topic: Council Goals for Re-engaging the Community

Arts, Campus and Gardens

ACG is interested in working with the Care for Creation committee and engaging youth to work on some outdoor projects to enhance our spaces. Three Eagle Scout candidates will be rebuilding sections of the boardwalk on the path around the pond as well as refurbish railings.

Youth are involved in helping to make new interior signage for the building. The kids are setting the signs up on the computers from which the signs are then burned into wood.

ACG hosted a parish clean up of outdoor spaces to engage parishioners in stewardship of our outdoor spaces. The council also has a goal to update the Welcome Garden outside Door #3.

LLDE

LLDE is planning on doing a "thank you" recognition event for the parish to acknowledge different areas of ministry. Tentative time they're considering is January.

Care and Support

Planning an ice cream social for the first weekend in August in conjunction with the 12 Baskets Back to School Drive.

Finance and Development

The council will provide 2-3 financial education events for the parish. One of the topics will be planned giving.

Phyllis noted that a basic presentation on budgeting and managing finances could be a good presentation for young people. Could even be a community-wide event.

3. Topic: Year with the St. John's Bible

Discussion: Carol Bishop

Carol reported that Brad Neary was here on May 5th to do two presentations about the St. John's Bible and the "Year With" program. He presented to staff and to council members to help them understand and prepare for our year which will begin with Advent.

Bruce noted that he was impressed with the focus areas of the Bible and felt they were in alignment with Pax, i.e. Science/Environment, Women, Racial inclusiveness and Technology. We should communicate that to people when we begin to promote the year.

4. Topic: Archdiocesan Synod

Phyllis notes that the final full Synod gathering will take place on Pentecost weekend. The group will be asked to discern which among 40 propositions should be priorities to move forward in this Archdiocese. Andy Leet and Paul Carlson are our delegates from Pax Christi. Both of them were involved in the parish small group discussions last fall. The Archbishop will submit a pastoral letter about the priorities on the feast of Christ the King, then a plan and guidelines will follow.

Call to Order: Meeting called to order at 7:31pm

Opening Prayer: Led by Kate Hanson

Approve Last Month Minutes: Moved to accept minutes by Paul Cress, seconded by Pat Nault.

1. Topic: Community Council Report Discussion: Led by Tish Osborn

Tish reviewed ACG goals (inviting youth, caring for creation, wayfinding, landscaping, maintaining building, etc.) presented to CC. Passed goals to Tom Scheller.

2. Topic: Art Committee Activities Discussion: Led by Dan Kohler

Group met for first time in two years. Planning fall art exhibit hoping to feature last artist whose work was missed due to Covid Restrictions. Planning STJB curation and will visit other places to see their displays.

3. Topic: Spring Clean Up Recap Discussion: Led by Paul Cress

Huge success and fun experience! 60 volunteers showed up 30 of whom were Scouts. People brought supplies and equipment including two with tractors and wagons. Accomplished list of chores by noon. Treats were a hit. Keep same for next year with host (Rene).

4. Topic: Eagle Scouts Bridge Projects Discussion: Led by Paul Cress

K of C donated \$300 to offset cost of materials. Dan K has ordered materials for two projects already. The third one is pending due to scout's illness. Work is progressing as hoped.

5. Topic: Ad Hoc Garden Updates

Discussion: Led by Tom Scheller and Paul Cress

Met with Bob Harvey Landscaping Group who presented two scenarios (varying from our original request).

- Scenario one- Move pine, bell tower-75', 4 flags remain in straight line, remove concrete and replace, triangle goes away.
- Scenario two- Remove triangle, add circle with sculpture as central focus with seating space and stone 18" high, flags in semi-circle out from center, plants along parking lot (which is a rain swale).

Additional presentation- Plantings and seating groupings along south side of building.

Bob has yet to send meeting summary (his original vision of a water feature will not work for us).

Dan K. drew his recollection of designs and council discussed priorities such as adding cross and bell tower and moving flagpoles. All agreed the most important goal is to make facility welcoming and attractive while responsibly using our resources. Better lighting is needed. It is important to keep design low enough to keep doors visible, keep statue as focal point, and to add garden feature. We also agreed that south side work is to be considered in plan but is not a current priority.

<u>Recap:</u> Plan big picture further and take small steps keeping the future in mind. Pursue options for needed funding. Either Dan K. or Carol B. should contact Bob and bring back our original idea from his first visit. It is likely that we will have to pay for future plans with graphics, which is fair and acceptable.

<u>Additional exterior news</u>- Dan K. met with EP fire inspector who said that <u>Pax should change door numbers</u> to go clockwise and that we should make the main entrance door # 1. This aligns well with our plan to change signage to be clearer.

6. Topic: Wayfinding Professional Update Discussion: Led by Tish Osborn

Gary is going to bring sign samples with images for both exterior and interior signs this week.

7. Topic: Rebranding and Signage Design Project Update Discussion: Led by Dan Kohler

Tom and Paul kept sign project going in Dan's absence. Most of the kids seem enjoying the work. Sanding must be completed. Staining and finishing the signs is the next task. Need adult volunteers for next sessions. Dan will reach out.

8. Topic: Continued St. John's Bible Plans Discussion: Led by Dan Kohler

As of now, the Chapel will house the Bible after issues with the floor are addressed. We need to build two standsone for display and one for liturgy use. Six prints will be part of the display. Tom S. and Tony A. will assist Dan K. with the construction of display stands.

1. Topic: Community Council Update Discussion: Jeanne Roffee

• Jeanne reported on the Community Council meeting; Details will be contained in the minutes of the Community Council

2. Topic: Re-engagement Wrap Up

- Doing nothing new was decided at the last meeting
- Will repeat a financial presentation which will include planned giving at a minimum
- Community council suggested some of these sessions could be focused on youth:
 - for example those going to college;
 - How to do budgets for families that are struggling
 - Also, something that can be used to reach out to the community not so insulate
- Discussion regarding Zoom vs in-person options, recorded, and use of outside resources such as Stonebridge or Catholic Community foundation.
- Next step: identify topics, then the third party that makes sense to partner with

3. Topic: Monthly Financial Review

- Lindsey completed the review no issues
- Agreed Upon Procedures (AUP) is due at the end of the fiscal year; required every 3 years.
- 3 accounting firms approved to use; Sue prefers to use the same firm as last time Bouley and get on the schedule for early fall.

4. Topic: Finance Director Report

Discussion: Sue Fier

- Sue reviewed the budget process, which used the actual 12 month period, compared to budget
- Other revenue was reviewed by line item
- General operations were reviewed
 - Notable changes include 3 new positions and a 5% salary increase
 - Professional services includes \$5k for the AUP and strategic planning costs
 - Hospitality will be starting up again so there is a significant increase there
 - Archdiocesan assessment will be going down for this year as it's assessed on a lag basis
- Sue reviewed the remaining expense items
- The current budget draft incorporates a 'plug' revenue number for contributions to arrive at a balanced budget. Sue does not think that we will achieve these contributions and that in fact we will be closer to \$2.4M resulting in a loss of from \$100k - \$200k
- A discussion ensued regarding the plug contribution number as well as the wisdom of budgeting a loss, either ever or for this year. At the conclusion of the discussion there was a consensus that:
 - We should not use a plug number but our actual estimate
 - We should budget a loss this year to invest in our re-engagement project, but not on an ongoing basis.
- Mark moved to approve the expense budget allowing the discussion on the revenue to continue, and Zach seconded it. Motion approved.

5. Topic: Investment Review

- Projected income for the next 12 months on Stonebridge Fixed Income portfolio is 2.89%; modified duration is 3.06 yrs
- Stonebridge return for April is -1.52%; management fees were incurred this period
- Vanguard return was -9.91%;
- Total Return was -3.13%
- Discussion regarding individual account returns and a reminder that we hold our bonds to term, so the negative return from bonds is only unrealized.
- General Cash Management, Capital Reserve, and Leadership development together have a net MTM gain of \$196,083, and Capital Reserve Account has Realized Gains of \$58,864 as a result of sales due to the investment policy of maintaining a maximum of 45% in equities and sales to fund the new video equipment, elevator, etc.
- Also, we have a policy to invest in the equity market, Should there be a significant decline in equity market prices.
- Conclusion that we are in place to weather the storm.
